I have a sign up process in place to view restricted documents. When a user signs up for the first time they are sent an Email to verify they are using a legitimate Email address. Click the link, return to the site to, Email is verified, given access to restricted area. Plain text Email, not html.

But it does appear to be an HTML email. Perhaps the email client only displays emails that are in plain text?
