Not yet having a moment to look into your suggestions, the actual behaviour my client complained about was that they were being logged out too quickly. Therefore they had circumstances where they typed a whole screen of text, pressed a save button and then found they were logged out.

They probably would not care if it took a week to log out, but I would certainly like be able to extend it to cover there working day (8 hours or so) rather than the current 1.5 hours it seems to be.

So any advice in this direction is welcome (but of course I do want to establish a general understanding for better control).
